Dear Partner,

Blessings in Messiah Jesus our Lord. We are still in the U.S., unable to get home to Israel because of COVID. We know the Lord has directed our steps and we are so grateful for your partnership through prayer and support.

Our pilgrimage through the U.S. bringing hope in the Gospel of Jesus continues



We thank God for His faithfulness in His Messiah Jesus. He is opening our hearts to better understand the American heart and culture, allowing the Gospel to be made more relevant to the hearer. Many value freedom above all other liberties, for it is true freedom we all long for.

It is only in Messiah Jesus that such a diverse nation can find one voice. "There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Messiah Jesus." Gal. 3:28. The Gospel and truth of Jesus is the true freedom people are looking for. Not only can one be saved from their sin, but society can be changed for the better. Let us pray for the U.S. to know Jesus, the Lord. The harvest truly is ripe!

In our last update we shared what the Lord did through WMO in California, Utah, and Wyoming. This month we share what the Lord did in Montana and South Dakota. A pastor in Montana shared with us that the state's young people battle with alcoholism, drugs, confusion, and an emotional rather than rational view of life. There is little accountability to the Word of God, and local churches struggle to find committed believers who remain faithful due to a strong spirit of worldliness and fear of rejection. As a result, many in their communities attempt to numb the pain and fill the void within with drugs instead of God. It is superficial healing rather than true healing coming from our Lord. His remarks touched our hearts to stay focused with the simple, yet powerful, Gospel of Jesus. The pastor asked us to pray for him this way, "for God to open discipleship opportunity with youth, to share the Gospel with the unsaved, and to lead his church members in using God's spiritual gifts and the power of His Love".

In South Dakota we had the privilege to speak twice on evangelism at Calvary Chapel Rapid City. We enjoyed day-to-day evangelism while camping and just doing life. We encountered many divine appointments and led a waitress named Ainek to the Lord. Darlene began sharing in English, but when she told us she was from Mexico I spoke to her in Spanish. The Lord is so in the details. We were also interviewed on a local radio station, encouraging listeners with the Gospel and to remain faithful. We loved South Dakota and the openness to the Gospel; such precious people. Please pray for the follow-up of Ainek.



Following the ministry in South Dakota, the Lord focused our attention on trials of a personal nature, using those trials to expand His kingdom. On August 31st, Darlene had a type of heart surgery; called a catheter ablation. We mentioned this for prayer in our last update. Subsequently, her cardiologist told her to rest for 30 days; however, on September 3rd, after sharing the Gospel with a Jewish family and visiting and praying for a homeless man who was inspired to trust Jesus, our car was hit from behind at high speed on the freeway. The collision damaged the back of the car pretty badly and both Darlene and I were injured. Through this though, the Gospel was shared with many nurses and doctors.

As was shared in the September update email, on September 10th Darlene received a phone call that her beloved brother Mason, who had been in a nursing home for the past few years, had passed away. A nurse had tried to awaken Mason for dinner, but he had passed in his sleep. We thanked God for His mercy and grace to give Mason such a peaceful transition from this temporal world to his eternal home in heaven. We were thankful that Mason had accepted Jesus as his Savior and Lord. We were thankful to brothers and sisters who had visited Mason at the nursing home prior to COVID lockdown to pray for him, and who held Bible studies with him so he could grow in Jesus. We recalled when God allowed us to lead Mason to Jesus and what a powerful day it was. We remembered that after Mason had placed his trust in Jesus as his Savior, we made a bonfire to burn all sorts of occult items. Mason knew he had been cleansed by the blood of Jesus and his new life as a child of God had been sealed by the resurrection of Jesus.



There was much planning to do for Mason's funeral and we saw the Lord show up in amazing ways. Too many to mention in this letter, but our faith was grown so much. Prior to Mason's burial, we went to Darlene's father's grave to check the headstone was in order. You may recall from the testimony email we sent out, we met a Jewish woman there, named Gaylene with whom we shared the gospel. She had an open heart as she listened, and in the end received Jesus as her

Lord and Savior. Even better, it was the evening of Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish feast commemorating the creation of the world, and marks the beginning of a ten-day period of inner searching and repentance culminating in Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement. Pray that Gaylene comes to understand that Yeshua took all her sins on the cross. Gaylene's name was given to a Messianic Pastor in Las Vegas for follow-up. We thank you for praying for her.

At Mason's funeral on September 22nd, held at a Las Vegas cemetery, we shared the Gospel with many unbelieving family members and invited them to trust in Jesus as Savior and Lord. We trust God for the fruits. Thank you to all who upheld us in prayer and support while we mourned the passing of our brother Mason.

Please pray for Christian, a young semi-homeless man struggling with drug addiction who heard the Gospel and received it with joy and conviction, as well as Makena who is Jewish and came to faith in Yeshua on the day before Yom Kippur and also her birthday. Please also pray for all the seeds sown, that they will take root and produce a great harvest. Those names have been given to a local pastor in Las Vegas for follow-up.

"Come unto Me all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest." Matt. 11:28.

We also appreciate your prayers for us as we wait to hear back from the Israeli consulate on whether we will be able to travel home on November 4th. Especially considering Israel is on a major lockdown. We have been on the road for nine months. We trust the Lord in His

perfect timing. If the door to go home closes again, please pray the Lord directs us to where He wants us. Currently, our only home is in Israel. We are praying for wisdom and favor, please pray for His provision in this. If you have a place on the west coast let us know. We need a base, reach out to us please.

Thank you for your prayers and support. They are bearing fruits for His glory. We love you and thank God for you. May the Lord bless you and your family.
